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A MESSAGE TO THE COMMUNITIES WE SERVE —

Springfield Hospital continues to make progress in growth and financial recovery in the face of a challenging environment.

Inpatient and professional services came in below budget, while outpatient utilization grew and exceeded budget. In a year challenged by rising labor, contracted staff, and supply costs, we have closely managed expenses while ensuring access to quality healthcare for our communities.

We have made investments in specialty medical staff including Gynecology, General Surgery, Urology and Podiatry. In addition, we've strengthened our Mental Health professional team, and are researching opportunities to return Cardiology services to the area. We are also pleased to report significant investment in our physical plant, air handlers, and clinical and diagnostic imaging equipment over the past year.

Across the nation, hospitals experienced unprecedented declines in operational performance. We performed better than many, ending the year with a slight operating loss. Given the inflationary environment, we are satisfied that we made the best of a very complex situation. Certainly, more work remains and close management will be the order of the day as we work to ensure Springfield Hospital and local access to quality healthcare services are sustainable well into the future.

Our journey continues, with a focus on our mission and our commitment to put 'People First' as we serve the healthcare needs of our local communities. We look forward to the new year with renewed energy and optimism.

Springfield Hospital and its Medical Staff Honor and Support Local Charities


National Doctors' Day was recognized by Springfield Hospital and its Medical Staff with matching donations from each directed to three local charities chosen by the medical staff.

Similar to national trends, inpatient care is transitioning to increased utilization of alternative outpatient care services.



































A YEAR OF SIGNIFICANT CAPITAL INVESTMENT





